Information on the festival week from 4 – 10 November 2019

Help and information

The programme pavilions at all seven locations will also include barrier-free infopoints. These are open daily from 10:00 to midnight
Please note: On 9 November, the info point at Brandenburg Gate will open at 3:00 p.m. Access to the barrier-free and wheelchair-accessible area is via two entrances on Ebertstraße, as well as the entrances on Straße des 17 Juni via Große Querallee, and on Yitzhak-Rabin-Straße.

Live speakers

During the festival week, from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., speakers will attend six of the festival venues: Alexanderplatz, Schlossplatz (Marx-Engels-Forum), Kurfürstendamm (Breitscheidplatz), East Side Gallery, Brandenburg Gate and Gethsemane Church (until 7 November). Six live speakers will present the topics of the open air exhibitions and invite visitors to join the dialogue. While facilitating active participation of visitors in the festival week, they will be available at the infopoints for discussions in both German and English with people from all age groups.

Barrier-free access

All areas will be fully accessible and equipped with barrier-free toilets. One exception is the Stasi headquarters, where the function room in the Haus 22 building can only be reached by stairs.

The show at the Brandenburg Gate on Saturday, 9 November from 5:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. is free of charge and open to the public.

The accreditation body is located at the corner of John-Foster-Dulles-Allee and Scheidemannstraße.

Getting there

The best way to get to the venue is by public transport via Hauptbahnhof, Potsdamer Platz or the S-Bahn station at Tiergarten. Cyclists should look for a place to lock up their bikes some distance from the site. We advise against travelling to the site by car.

Rules for the site

Please note that alcoholic beverages and liquids over half a litre in volume and in glass bottles are not permitted. Furthermore, bags larger than A4 format are not permitted. Bicycles, (electric) scooters, skateboards, Segways and similar are not permitted anywhere on this site (exceptions to this are walking aids, wheelchairs, pushchairs, and similar). Animals (with the exception of guide/assistance dogs), fireworks, weapons, banned intoxicants, cane-format umbrellas, and selfie sticks are also prohibited. There are no facilities for storing bags.
